#### SITUATION UPDATE

According to the Ministry of Health (MoH) in Gaza, the situation remains dire, with significant loss of life and injuries. From October 7, 2024, to July 9, 2025, there were 57,680 reported fatalities and 137,409 injuries among Palestinians. This represents a concerning increase since March 18, 2025, when the escalation of hostilities led to 5,833 fatalities and 20,198 injuries (OCHA, July 10, 2025). In its latest report, OCHA indicates that medical personnel in Gaza are under intense strain, battling to manage the constant stream of trauma cases while enduring significant shortages of fuel, medications, supplies, and available hospital beds.

Additionally, the people of Gaza remain unable to meet their basic needs, confronted with daily threats to safety and security and displacement. OCHA and UNICEF have reported that one million people face food insecurity and over one million children are in need of mental health services (OCHA, 2025).

#### SAMS INTERVENTIONS IN GAZA STRIP

Despite the recent disruptions, SAMS Foundation's team in Gaza is proactively addressing the urgent healthcare needs in Gaza, navigating the challenges that persist. To counteract limited access to healthcare and the rising number of displaced individuals, SAMS is deploying mobile medical outreach services. In addition to providing accessible and affordable dental care and ensuring that essential medications and IPC materials are readily available to those in need.

### IMPROVING ACCESS TO MATERNAL, CHILD, AND YOUTH HEALTH CARE AND PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT

A significant highlight of SAMS's response efforts was its collaboration with the Palestinian Medical Relief Society (PMRS). In April 2025, the joint mobile outreach teams provided an extensive range of healthcare services to 8,580 beneficiaries throughout the Gaza Strip.

As the situation evolved, with changing displacement patterns and a breakdown of the ceasefire, teams transitioned between mid-February and April to expand their coverage into northern Gaza while maintaining their presence in Gaza City.

Notably, maternal and child health services reached 77% of all beneficiaries. These services included antenatal and postnatal care, as well as child health consultations and treatment for acute illnesses, specifically targeting women, children, and youth—the most vulnerable groups during emergencies.

### **DENTAL CLINIC -PALESTINIAN MEDICAL** CENTER, NUSEIRAT CAMP, **DEIR-ELBALAH**

SAMS has maintained its support for the Dental Clinic at the Palestinian Medical Center, which continues to provide a wide range of essential dental services. These services encompass but are not limited to, tooth extractions, treatment for tooth decay, gum disease treatment, root canals, and prosthetic restorations.

Between April and June 2025, the dental team successfully met the considerable needs of the community by providing 5,110 vital dental services to 3,436 individuals. This high volume of care indicates the ongoing and unmet demand for dental health services within the community.

#### **MOBILE MEDICAL TEAMS**

SAMS Foundation is spearheading a rapid emergency health response across southern and northern Gaza through the deployment of 3 mobile units. The units provide Primary Health Care (PHC) services, along with emergency medical consultations and procedures. These interventions are delivered directly by SAMS field staff. Each team includes a General Practitioner, Obstetrician-Gynecologist, Nurse, Midwife, and Social Worker. The teams are equipped with the necessary medications and medical supplies to respond to the community's healthcare needs effectively.

In North and South Gaza, SAMS-Healthcare and Development Association (HCDA) teams conducted health missions through a static medical point and outreach activities in shelters in North and South Gaza. Services delivered include general medicine consultations, sexual and reproductive health consultations, wound care, midwifery services for pregnant women, psychological support, health promotion, and referrals to specialists, where pathways exist. SAMS also contributes to the Early Warning, Alert, and Response System (EWARS), to support timely detection and response to disease outbreaks.

In Northern Gaza (in Gaza city: Remal, Sheikh Redwan, Galaa), the teams assisted 10,710 beneficiaries between May and June.

In Southern Gaza: Deir-ElBalah Governorate: Nusierat, Buraig, Maghazi, Deir-ElBalah from April 19 to June 18, the teams supported 9,593 beneficiaries.
