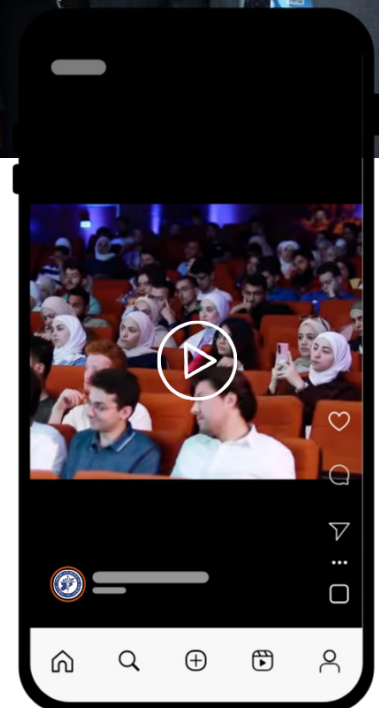
Returning and Rebuilding Syria's Healthcare System



SAMS 24th International Conference: Advancing Healthcare Through Collaboration and Innovation

The 24th Syrian American Medical Society (SAMS) International Conference concluded in Aleppo after three inspiring days of scientific exchange, collaboration, and partnership, bringing together leading physicians, experts, researchers, and healthcare professionals from Syria and around the world under the theme, “Transforming Healthcare and Restoring Hope: Collaborative Pathways Toward Sustainable, High-Quality Healthcare in Syria.”

The conference marked one of the largest medical and scientific gatherings held in Syria in recent years, welcoming more than 2,500 participants and over 300 international physicians, experts, and academics, including 250 physicians from the United States and 59 experts and researchers from across the globe. The event highlighted the strength of international medical solidarity and a shared commitment to rebuilding and advancing Syria’s healthcare system.

Over three days, the conference featured:

- 5 plenary sessions
- 16 parallel scientific sessions
- 3 keynote lectures
- More than 150 specialized scientific presentations

- More than 25 hands-on workshops and training sessions
- A two-day Dental Scientific Conference
- A dedicated Pediatric Scientific Day
- More than 90 scientific research posters showcasing the latest medical studies and research across a wide range of specialties



The conference also coincided with SAMS' largest medical mission to Syria, involving more than 200 volunteers across Syrian governorates who provided free medical services, performed specialized surgeries, delivered advanced training programs, conducted workshops, and organized scientific educational activities for local healthcare professionals.

Return & Rebuild Medical Mission 2026

More than 155 volunteer physicians returned to Syria this month, delivering specialized care across eleven governorates while helping rebuild the country's healthcare system. The mission took place in two phases, from June 20–25 and June 30–July 2, providing medical, surgical, dental, and educational services to communities in need.

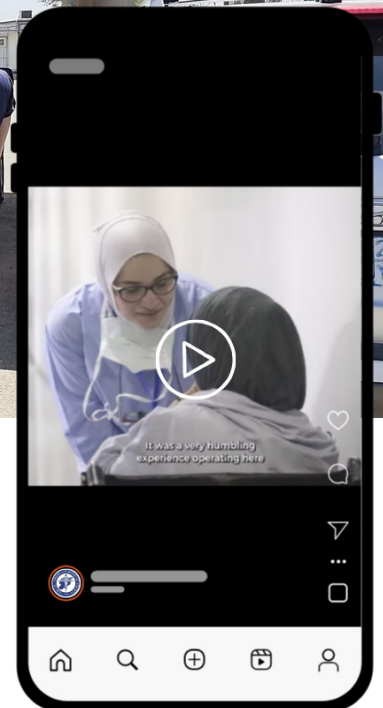
Beyond their medical expertise, these volunteers were united by a shared commitment to rebuilding Syria's healthcare system and restoring access to essential care. As Dr. Aref Rifai, President of Syrian American Medical Society, shared:

It is the journey and commitment of a dedicated group of volunteers returning home with a healing-driven spirit, hope in their hearts, and a commitment to help rebuild the future of Syria.” Your support helps fund surgeries, medications, medical supplies, and training opportunities that strengthen local healthcare systems and expand access to specialized care for thousands of patients in need.



Volunteer teams delivered multispecialty care across areas including ophthalmology, surgery, interventional cardiology, pediatrics, internal medicine, mental health, oncology, endocrinology, infectious diseases, nephrology, gastroenterology, dermatology, radiology, and more.

Teams were deployed across Syria, reaching communities in Deir Ezzor, Al-Hasaka, Raqqqa, Hama, Homs, Damascus, Daraa, Aleppo, Idlib, Tartous, and Latakia.

SAMS and Ministry of Social Affairs Partner to Advance Autism Care in Syria

A delegation from the Syrian American Medical Society (SAMS) met with Syria's Minister of Social Affairs and Labor, Dr. Hind Kabawat, to discuss opportunities to expand and strengthen the long-term sustainability of the SAMS Autism Academy, with the shared goal of advancing a more comprehensive and coordinated system of care for children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and other developmental disorders.



The discussions highlighted key priorities for improving autism services in Syria, including the expansion of early screening and diagnostic capacity to support earlier identification and intervention. Both sides also emphasized the importance of strengthening workforce development through internationally recognized training pathways and professional standards, helping to build a more skilled and sustainable network of specialists in the field.



In addition, the meeting explored ways to further empower families by equipping them with the knowledge, tools, and skills needed to actively participate in their children's treatment and long-term rehabilitation. The delegation and the Ministry also discussed expanding the Academy's range of services to include behavioral therapy, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, hearing assessments, and electroencephalogram (EEG) services, in close collaboration with the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor.



The meeting brought together Minister Dr. Hind Kabawat, SAMS Board Chair Dr. Louay Alkotob, Country Director Baraa Alsmoudi, and members of the SAMS Autism Academy leadership team, underscoring a shared commitment to building sustainable, high-quality, and accessible autism services that improve developmental outcomes for children and strengthen support for families across Syria.



Young Professional conference: Empowering the Next Generation of Healthcare Leaders in Syria

As part of the 24th SAMS International Conference, SAMS launched the Second Young Professionals Conference in Aleppo under the theme “Building the Physician of the Future.” The conference brought together physicians, healthcare professionals, students, and experts for a day focused on inspiring and preparing the next generation of medical leaders.



The event provided a platform for young healthcare professionals to engage in meaningful discussions, exchange knowledge, and explore pathways for professional and academic growth. Through interactive sessions and panel discussions, participants explored topics including humanitarian medical experiences, the Syrian healthcare system, scientific research, academic publishing, and medical education opportunities.

Beyond education and networking, the conference highlighted the importance of volunteerism, service, and collaboration in shaping the future of healthcare. By connecting emerging professionals with experienced physicians and experts, SAMS continues to foster a community dedicated to advancing medical knowledge and strengthening healthcare systems.

Strengthening Healthcare Access for Underserved Communities in Northeast Syria

For communities in Northeast Syria, many of which have faced years of instability and limited access to healthcare, receiving timely and quality medical care remains a significant challenge. Strengthening local health facilities is critical to ensuring that families do not have to travel long distances to access essential services.



With support from the Aid Fund for Syria (AFS), SAMS has rehabilitated and equipped the Maadan Health Center in Rural Raqqa and the Al-Shaddadi Health Center in Rural Al-Hasakah. These efforts have helped transform the facilities into more capable and reliable sources of care by providing essential medical equipment, medications, supplies, and training opportunities for healthcare workers.



Through these improvements, local medical teams are better equipped to respond to the healthcare needs of their communities and provide more consistent, comprehensive services. The project also supports SAMS' broader commitment to strengthening Syria's healthcare system by investing in local infrastructure and empowering healthcare workers.



Building on this foundation, SAMS continues to expand access to critical health services, with a focus on maternal and child health, preventive care, and mental health and psychosocial support. By bringing comprehensive healthcare closer to vulnerable families, SAMS is helping communities build greater resilience and ensuring that more people can access the care they need when they need it most.





Bringing Care Closer: Johanniter Visits SAMS Mobile Medical Clinics in Lebanon Through Collaboration and Innovation

Building Resilience and Hope for Families in Zaatari Refugee Camp

For families living in Zaatari Refugee Camp, support goes beyond addressing immediate needs, it means creating opportunities for individuals and families to build resilience, strengthen relationships, and navigate life's challenges with greater confidence.



Through SAMS' Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) program, two specialized initiatives are helping adolescents and their caregivers develop the skills and support they need to thrive. The first program, Helping Hand, provides adolescents with tools to strengthen resilience, manage challenges, and build confidence as they look toward the future.

A second program focuses on parents and caregivers, offering guidance and practical skills to better understand adolescents' experiences, improve communication, and create a more supportive home environment. By strengthening family connections, the program helps foster emotional well-being and stability within the community.



Through these efforts, SAMS is supporting the mental health and resilience of adolescents and their families, helping build stronger, healthier communities where individuals have the support they need to move forward.



Strengthening Mental Health Support in Gaza Through Collaboration

As part of our ongoing commitment to expanding access to mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) services in Gaza, SAMS participated in the “Stronger Together” MHPSS event, organized by International Medical Corps in collaboration with the World Health Organization’s MHPSS Technical Working Group.

The event brought together approximately 40 local and international organizations working to address the growing mental health needs of communities across Gaza. Amid the continued challenges faced by individuals and families affected by conflict, displacement, and loss, the gathering provided an important platform for humanitarian partners to exchange experiences, share best practices, showcase their programs, strengthen coordination, and improve referral pathways to ensure that those in need can access timely and appropriate care.

During the event, SAMS highlighted our integrated approach to healthcare, which combines primary healthcare services, mental health and psychosocial support, protection-related services, health education, and referrals to provide comprehensive care for communities affected by crisis. By addressing both physical and psychological needs, SAMS works to ensure that individuals and families receive the support they need to navigate the lasting impacts of trauma and adversity.

Through our participation and collaboration with humanitarian partners, we continue to strengthen collective efforts to expand access to essential mental health services in Gaza. As the need for psychosocial support continues to grow, SAMS remains committed to delivering compassionate, comprehensive care and supporting communities on their path toward recovery and resilience.





Emergency Response: Supporting Communities One Month After Flooding in Northeast Syria

One month after severe flooding caused by rising water levels in the Euphrates River, SAMS continues to support communities in Northeast Syria as families recover from the impact of the disaster. The flooding displaced families, disrupted access to essential services, and created urgent health needs across affected communities.

In response, SAMS deployed a mobile clinic to provide critical medical care to flood-affected families, bringing healthcare services closer to those facing barriers to access. SAMS medical teams provided free consultations, medications, and follow-up care, treating children for conditions including respiratory infections, anemia, dehydration, and skin conditions. Pregnant women received essential prenatal care and maternal health support, while adults were treated for acute and chronic health conditions, including influenza, fever, and other illnesses.

SAMS also coordinated with Noor Al-Hayat and Man Ahyaaaha to deliver an emergency convoy carrying essential medicines and medical supplies to strengthen healthcare services in affected areas. The shipment traveled from northern Syria to Deir Ezzor, where supplies were provided to the Provincial Health Directorate to support local response efforts and help meet the ongoing medical needs of communities.



As families continue to navigate the effects of the flooding, SAMS remains committed to providing lifesaving healthcare, strengthening local health systems, and ensuring vulnerable communities receive the support they need during recovery. Through continued emergency response efforts, SAMS is helping families rebuild and regain access to essential care.

SAMS Institute: Advancing Medical Education Through Scientific Conferences in Aleppo and Latakia

As part of the 24th SAMS International Conference in Aleppo, SAMS launched the first hands-on workshops at the SAMS Simulation Lab, offering healthcare professionals an immersive training experience focused on strengthening clinical skills through simulation-based medical education.

The opening workshops provided participants with the opportunity to practice essential medical techniques in a realistic learning environment, guided by experienced instructors. Sessions focused on critical areas of emergency and patient care, including Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS), airway management, intubation, central line placement, and vascular access.

Through a combination of practical demonstrations, hands-on exercises, and peer learning, participants enhanced their ability to manage complex clinical scenarios and respond effectively in high-pressure medical situations. These trainings help bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world practice, ensuring healthcare professionals are better prepared to deliver safe and effective patient care.



The workshops reflect SAMS' ongoing commitment to advancing medical education, strengthening healthcare capacity, and investing in the next generation of healthcare professionals. By expanding access to high-quality training and creating opportunities for continuous learning, SAMS continues to support the growth of skilled medical teams and the future of healthcare in Syria.
